




Bible Stacks






OPPORTUNITIES TO LEARN

Theology Programme Otago University and KCML Summer School 2026

From **26-30** January **2026**, Professor Lynn Cohick will teach an intensive course in Dunedin entitled *Women in the New Testament and Early Church*. Lynn is Distinguished Professor of New Testament and Director of the Houston Theological Seminary at Houston Christian University. This course will explore women's participation in and contributions to the Christian story in the first five centuries and discuss women's participation in the church today. Fees and travel subsidies are available to PCANZ ministers in good standing. The course can be taken for credit or audit. To enrol for
